

# MARKING 7 YEARS ON THE JOURNEY OF PROGRESS

We are making steady progress on the road to safely decommissioning Fukushima Daiichi: Reducing radiation, improving the work environment, cleaning and managing water, and helping to revitalize Fukushima.



## WORK ENVIRONMENT

Decreased radiation level allowing workers to wear regular uniforms at 96% of the site.



## EXPOSURE

Workers can check radiation levels at 86 locations around the plant, both on location and via touch-screen displays in buildings.

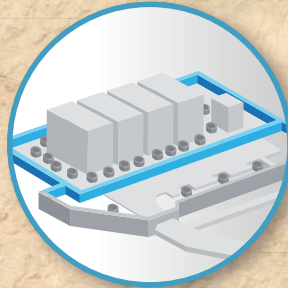


## REVITALIZED

The large rest house offers workers hot meals daily, a convenience store, and hot showers, and the nearby Fukushima Revitalization Meal Service Center uses local produce and food ingredients, employing local residents.

## REDIRECT

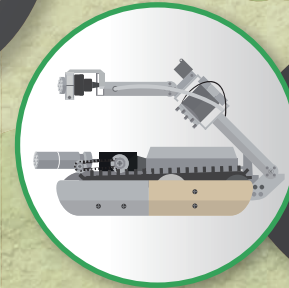
The 1500m 'ice wall,' designed to form an underground barrier around Units 1-4, has been activated.

## BYPASS

An underground bypass and subdrain system pump and discharge groundwater before it enters the reactor buildings.

## PREPARATION

Completed removal of the Unit 1 cover, and installation of the Unit 3 cover in order to remove the spent fuel.



## ROBOTS

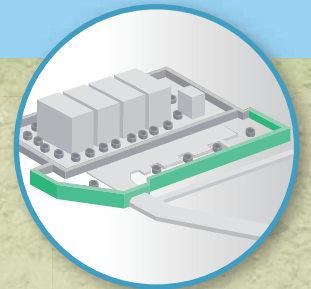
Innovative robots are going safely into places where humans cannot, providing critically important data on the status of the reactors.



## WATER MANAGEMENT

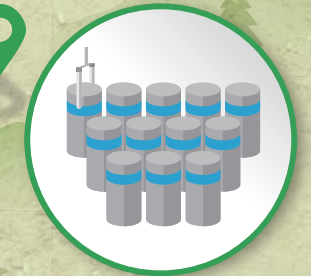
## BLOCK

A seaside impermeable wall blocks groundwater from flowing into the port area, allowing it to be pumped up, treated, and safely discharged. Cesium levels in the surrounding area are below the regulatory standard.



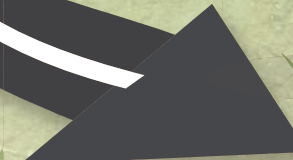
## FUEL REMOVAL

The first step to safe decommissioning work, removing fuel from the spent fuel pool of Unit 4, is complete.



## DECOMMISSIONING

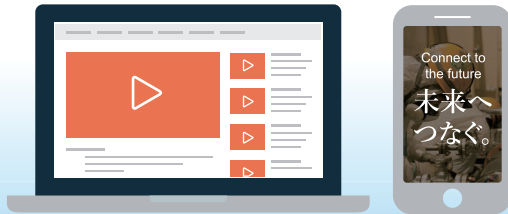
Progress continues in the long-term goal of safe decommissioning and the revitalization of Fukushima.

Newsletters cover a variety of topics including safety tips and worker voices.

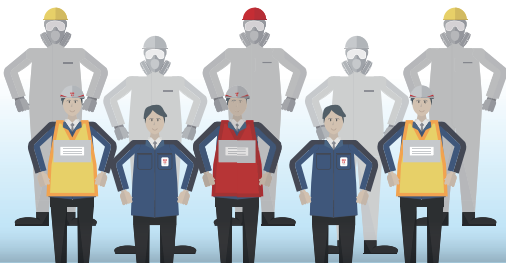
